Summer Fun for All Ages! Ridge-a-Palooza!



New National Night Out Kickoff on July 30

Since 1984, National Night Out (NNO) has been observed on the first Tuesday in August to bring attention to the related issues of Crime Prevention and the concept of Neighborhood Watch.

It started with Americans being asked to turn on their porch lights early, from 6:00 to 8:30 p.m., as a public statement against crime. Beyond that simple effort, people were encouraged to get out on their front porches or to walk their neighborhood sidewalks and to meet any neighbors that they did not already know. Some communities hold Crime Prevention and Neighborhood Watch events on National Night Out.

By getting to know our neighbors and by letting them get to know us, the whole neighborhood becomes engaged in the shared experience of life and community. Neighbors begin to look out for each other and more easily recognize situations that may be a crime in progress, a health emergency, lost child, or other situation that indicates a need for help from neighbors, police, or other emergency responders.

To help raise awareness of and to boost participation in this year's National Night Out, Blendon Township will be hosting a kickoff event at the Blendon Township Police Department, 6340 Hempstead Road, on Saturday, July 30, 2011, from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. Police cruisers and fire trucks will be on display as well as karate demonstrations, the Med-Flight helicopter, and a bounce house for kids. A drivethrough **Prevent ID Theft** shredding station will destroy any sensitive documents that you drop off, and crime prevention officers will have information on the Block Watch in your neighborhood.

Please join us for the kickoff on July 30 and then get out on your front porch or sidewalk and show your support for National Night Out on the following Tuesday evening, August 2.

Question: What do you like best about your job as a realtor? Barbara's Response: Seeing the joy on buyers' faces as they find their dream homes and realizing that I had a special part in helping them find those homes. Also, in helping many sellers close on a home and move on to their next home here in Ohio or out of state or out of the country. With many of them, I still remain in contact and enjoy the friendship as well as hearing what is going on in their lives and being able to visit them at their new homes.

Question: What do you like least about your job? **Barbara's Response:** Having to share with sellers that they owe more on their home than they can sell it for—many times meaning they would bring money to the closing table or take other avenues.

Question: Can you offer any tips for someone wanting to sell his or her home in Huber Ridge? **Barbara's Response:** Curb appeal is a big attraction and improves the looks—so important! Listen to a staging professional or your realtor and then do what they tell you to do to prepare your home for sale. We use lots of pictures on the internet; they tell a big story to that buyer looking.

Question: Can you offer any tips for someone wanting to buy a home in Huber Ridge? **Barbara's Response:** After talking with a lender, you as a buyer will know your price range. Buyers then look for homes that meet the needs on their list of "wants" in a home. Make a list of maybe ten things and star five or six that are most important to you. Meet with a realtor who knows the community and the Westerville area. Those realtors have a wealth of knowledge.

Question: Do you see the sale of homes improving in our area? **Barbara's Response:** Because of the strong Huber Ridge Area Association, I have seen great pride in home ownership developing and this area becoming more attractive to those looking to buy. A strong school system important to parents—and being near freeway systems for an easier commute to work make Huber Ridge a sought-after community.

Question: Huber Ridge has a lot to offer home buyers, but one negative is the high cost of water. How would you sell a home to someone who liked the area but was discouraged by the high water rates? **Barbara's Response:** Research resources and ways to save water—update baths and use rain barrels if you are a gardener. Perhaps moving here will put you closer to work thereby saving gas. If homes are updated, that may save on electric and gas bills.

Question: What do you offer as a realtor that sets you apart from other realtors? **Barbara's Response:** I sit down and listen to the goals of the buyers and sellers. In each case, there is a plan of action we take to accomplish the selling of their homes. In the buyer's case, I encourage them to talk with a lender first. That way, I can help them look for that special home that meets their financial guidelines. A home is important, but it is also important not to overspend and to be able to have finances to enjoy other things in life.

Question: Do you have a personal mission statement, philosophy, or governing principle that guides and directs your actions as a realtor? **Barbara's Response:** Character, honesty, and integrity are important qualities to have in life and business. I work hard to put them first for my buyers, sellers, friends and acquaintances in life as well as those involved in my real estate transactions. To help buyers and sellers make good decisions most often brings them joy and enrichment to their lives. I feel it most important to treat all people with kindness and respect, which brings many rewards in all areas of life. Aretha Franklin says it well in her song, R-E-S-P-E-C-T.

Question: Is there anything else about your work as a realtor or about yourself that you would like people to know? Barbara's Response: I belong to the Westerville-Northeast Realtors Association, and we give back to the community in programs such as W.A.R.M. and help to support Honor Flight, which sends WWII veterans on a free flight to Washington, D.C. to honor them with a tour of the WWII memorial. My husband, Rodger, and I are also on the Ground Crew and go to help get veterans on the flight by 6:30 a.m. (departure time); and we are there when they return home about 8:30 p.m. on that same Saturday night at Southwest Airlines. I enjoy meeting people and volunteering. I volunteer one Saturday a month at a free clinic, Grace in the City, Hardin Clinic-using my nursing skills and helping people. Another security light is being installed in the shelter with the grant money, also. The flower beds at the entrance to the Park were weeded and mulched. The trail in the woods was given a new layer of mulch, and a path that had become impassible was cleared and mulched.

Our Blendon Township Trustees bought tree seedlings for us to plant. Oak, hickory, pine, and pussy willow trees were planted throughout the Park under the direction of Byron Mann with the help of the Blendon/Westerville Little League. The Trustees also paid for lunch and other supplies that were used for park maintenance. Breakfast was paid for by Ohio American Water Company. They also gave us plenty of bottled water for the day and sent handy reusable water bottles home with everyone.

We had more than 50 neighbors, Little Leaguers, and Scouts spend part of their Saturday with us. Those who helped were given a T-shirt from McGraw-Hill in honor of their Global Volunteer Day effort.

Many of the wooden structures in the park didn't get repainted because of the excessive rain we've had this year. The benches and bridge need to be stained—some for the first time. 
