

We've all seen the horrifying headlines as printed in the Columbus Dispatch:

- "Two girls arrested in cyberbully suicide case"
- "Online child-predator sting leads to 44 arrests"
- "Ohio teen killed self over 'sexting' of nude photos, lawsuit says"
- "So far, 14 men charged with operating child pornography website"

Protecting children from these types of crime becomes all that much more difficult if they are allowed to use the internet. If you are a parent, grandparent, family member or friend of a child who uses the internet, you will find this Block Watch meeting useful.

Jane lived her life with as much joy as she possibly could. Her motto was "more joy." Barb and Andy found it fitting to call our 5k the "More Joy Run".



He was awarded the bronze medal in Taekwondo during the 1988 Seoul, Korea summer Olympics in addition to being National Taekwondo champion nine times and elected the Olympic Development Coach of the year in 2000. Greg's Taekwondo Center embodies his champion spirit by not only training on the karate techniques but also by promoting development of character, good work ethic and ultimately building confidence in his students. Clearly a successful strategy as Greg has taught students who have gone on to win National and World Championships.

Students can begin training at the Baker Taekwondo Center as early as 5 years old in private or group lessons. 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WARM has a new location

When the Westerville Area Resource Ministry (WARM), began in 1972, few would have guessed the impact it would have on the community in the years to come. What began as a vision of volunteers who were members of St. Paul's Catholic Church to help families in need with food. clothing and emergency financial aid has now become a strong pillar of Westerville; a place where individuals or families who need help are given a hand up; not a hand out.

As a result of that growth, WARM moved from their 175 E. Broadway location of 7,000 square feet, to its present location at 150 Heatherdown, with roughly 42,000 square feet, in July of 2014. Recently WARM held its formal grand opening to share its wonderful new home with the public. The new accommodations have allowed WARM to expand their services, and with a large warehouse area and dock, take advantage of buying in bulk to reduce costs and provide more products for their clients.

Clients of WARM meet with life coaches at each visit, and are able to shop in the pantry twice a month. The meetings with coaches are to assess any other needs a client may have to help them reach self-sufficiency goals, such as financial planning (spending plans, guidance with avoiding foreclosures or help with deferring student loans), or employment (resume and cover letters, mock interviews, etc.). One coach specializes in helping the senior citizens in our community who are struggling to live on meager pensions.

Recently, WARM and the Share Bac a Pac program announced their collaboration in the mission to provide food to Westerville students who are at risk of hunger on the weekends. Share Bac A Pac was created with one goal in mind – to make sure that no child goes hungry. Approximately 4,530 of the total 13,480 students in the Westerville School district qualify for this program. The new facility provides the space and combining resources will help the program grow as the need for it continues to rise.

If you have a chance to tour the new facility, by all means take the time to do so. It is a strong testament to what a few volunteers, a strong church community, faith, love and commitment to help our own can do and be for folks in Westerville who are trying to help themselves.

Blendon Township Central Cemetery

Linda Harter, a Westerville resident, joined Blendon Township in May 2004. She holds dual responsibilities; Administration Assistant and Cemetarian.

The Blendon Township Trustees are responsible for the care and control of Blendon Central Cemetery.

The reason it has been called "Central" Cemetery is because it is located at the geographic center of the original Blendon Township. There is a metal box buried at the corner of Dempsey and Hempstead, the geographical center that contains the original surveyor's stone.

In 1976, a Military Roll of Honor was interred at the cemetery. There is a list of over 100 veterans. Also, 160 badly weathered markers were restored.

Land for the cemetery was donated by Timothy Lee and Edward Phelps, Sr. in 1829. Many historical persons are buried on the grounds.

In 2011 we acquired the mausoleum and chapel. There are 13,000 gravesites at this time with 7,500 left. Families can now purchase private mausoleums for family members. You may call the cemetery office for information concerning rates.

We are indeed proud of our beautifully kept cemetery.
